ON-DEMAND OUTCOMES

Wisconsin Virtual Academies (WVA) McFarland, WI

An identified school need and course customization resulted in nearly 1000 training session completions in the final quarter of SY2324.



SCHOOL DATA



Wisconsin Virtual Academies (WVA) are tuitionfree and fully online public schools for students in 4K-12 administered as a non-instrumentality charter school by the McFarland School District. They provide equitable services, practices and resources to meet the diverse needs of all learners, through personalized planning – regardless of location, background, or need. With two decades of operation, school enrollment has exceeded 4,000 students.

- 180 teachers and counselors
- 67% economically disadvantaged
- 29% special education

NEED -

Compliance training for teachers is always a challenge - especially when there is a blend of asynchronous, state-provided training coupled with school-based, live sessions. Administrators must facilitate completion of these mandated requirements while balancing the everyday, normal actions of a school. Simply, this professional learning needs a single solution that allows teachers to access the content without minimizing precious planning and instructional time. Understanding this need for balance, the leaders at WVA began to look for a new pathway ahead. They turned to an existing partner – one whom their teachers recognized due to previous experience and one who could understand their school needs.

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SOLUTION -

Since teachers were already using Stride Professional Development (Stride PD), WVA requested a meeting in October 2023 to discuss their need. This initial discussion led to a course customization that would be fully implemented in SY2425. Late in January 2024, however, Dr. Sara Cutler identified a more pressing need and asked for an earlier delivery – one that would prepare teachers for state testing. Stride PD leveraged its team, adjusted the timeline, and delivered a course that addressed the school's request.

The school implementation plan rested with Becky Eberhardt, the special programs Academic Administrator, who compiled the material, worked with the instructional designers, and then pushed the training to the teachers. She decided the best approach was to leverage the on-demand professional development inside of protected timeslots. This dedicated time allowed teachers to focus on their primary responsibilities of instruction and academic planning. Teachers appreciated the centralized location of the material and chunked approach allowing for completion over time. When they say, 'by educators and for educators,' Stride PD means it. Their experience allowed them to quickly catch my vision for the project and turn it into a reality for our teachers."

OUTCOMES .

The quick response of modifying the timeline helped the school ensure teachers were prepared for the end of year testing season. This modified experience resulted in the completion of nearly 1000 training sessions, including content refreshers in blood-borne pathogens, de-escalation, medication administration, and others. In polling teachers who completed the training, an overwhelming majority – 96% - indicated they preferred this new, ondemand format. The success of this initial, customized training has already been replicated. WVA worked with Stride PD to build out a full, on-demand compliance package for their educators. This effort matches the results of recent surveys by Stride PD where only 12% of respondents indicate that teachers and leaders need less on-demand training. For WVA specifically, a multimodule course was successfully launched at the beginning of SY2425 and, in a couple of short weeks, has already seen more than 2700 lesson completions.





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
